Fleet Study Group

Minutes of the 69th meeting of the Fleet Study Group held at Brooklands, Farm, Forston 28th July 2000

1. Chairman reported the death of Dr Christopher Wagner, the distinguished pathologist who, with his wife Dr Margaret Wagner, joined FSG in 1989. Between then and 1995 they undertook historical archival research relevant to the Fleet. Their notes and abstracts provided a valuable new background to the Fleet archive. They resigned from the FSG last year on planning to move from the area. Chairman will write to Margaret from FSG expressing our appreciation and condolences.

Min. 4. World Heritage Site Status

The nomination document ("Nomination of the Dorset and East Devon Coast for inclusion in the World Heritage List") is now complete and has been submitted by Government to UNESCO. A copy will go into the FSG archive. A UNESCO assessor will visit in the autumn and a final decision made by December 2001.

5. REPORTS FROM REPRESENTATIVES

Two written reports were circulated with the agenda. Enc. 1., The Dorset Coast Forum Progress Report to July 2000, was summarised by BL for the benefit of some members who did not receive a copy (available from the Secretary).

The marine database, currently housed by DWT may move to DERC next spring.

The seafood cookbook was launched on 2 July and copies are available through DWT.

The bid for Life III included Roxana and Side Scan Sonar survey of specified areas off the Dorset coast. DRS proposed that one of these areas should cover the seabed off Chesil Beach between Abbotsbury and West Bexington from where suspected "proto-Fleet bed" remains were occasionally washed up. He would liaise with BL to specify the extent.

8. CURRENT and RECENTLY COMPLETED RESEARCH

- a) Archaeology. DRS circulated a photo by Gordon LePard of part of an 18th century map depicting the medieval causeway across the Fleet near Shipmoor Point "where wagons go over at low water DRS,DM and G. LePard are meeting members of the Nautical Archaeological Society at the site to discuss a site survey this summer.
- b) JW raised the topic of the 1635 attempts to drain (part?) of the Fleet which would have included building dams, perhaps including this site. Possible topic for future meeting presentation.
- c) Botany. EN have funded a study by A Martin on Lamprothamnium in the Fleet and elsewhere in the UK. This will be presented as a 4th Symposium paper.

9. RESEARCH PROPOSALS

(a) Statement of Natural Change (Enc. 2 - English Nature)

VC requested comments from members on defining types of change (natural/unnatural) and views on the effects of such change on Chesil and the Fleet. After discussion it was agreed the subject would form the presentation and discussion topic at the March 2001 FSG meeting.

b) Proposal for further palaeo-environmental research in the Fleet (p.4 of the last minutes, 24 March 2000)

PO'S was unable to attend the meeting. Consequently the pre-meeting planned to discuss his proposal has been postponed until after the Symposium and next meeting.

c) Other proposals.

JW and KC are continuing work on KC's cores in relation to chronology of the Fleet.

JW hopes to pursue the possiblility of getting dredged samples of "pro Fleet bed" as discussed in the last minutes.
