4. Reports from Representatives:

JDMC – presentation on the Invest in Fish Project - not clear as to the extent of Dorset's involvement – to be taken forward through DCF. Kimmeridge – volunteer wardens are being trained to undertake basic research. Updates were given on the Poole Harbour proposed dredging, various proposed marina developments, dredging in Christchurch Harbour and the EA's review of consents.

DCF – Water quality was the main theme – presentations were given by the EA, Wessex Water, English Nature, Ilchester Estates among others.

Annual Fleet SAC meeting. Large number of attendees. Two main points – SAC status now achieved. Little terns – difficulty with helping the colony in any way. Excellent reports produced by Don Moxom, Ed Harland, Dave wheeler.

5. Current and recent research – None notified.

6. Chesil Survey points update – Angle irons (30 markers at 500 metre intervals) have been installed and surveyed. The network is intended as a memorial to Alan Carr.

7. Memorial to Alan Carr – Don Moxom is arranging for a block (similar to a trig point) with plaques. Ceremony planned for July.

8. Proceedings of the IVth Fleet Symposium – Two papers still outstanding, also problems with contacting the publishers.
